Mr Mead gave a most interesting talk, illustrated by slides, on the activities of the Wellington Botanical Society. The mountain ranges running north from Wellington provide for the botanist, a fine variety of hill and dale, forest and scrub, shingled river beds, lagoons and sea cliffs. While I like the forest and the coast I must confess to being fascinated most by the river beds. In part I suppose because we have nothing like them around Auckland: but I feel also that there is something basic or fundamental about them: rather like the open fire in the hearth which comforts as well as warms. Mr Mead's colour photography is excellent and he describes his wanderings with a quiet enthusiasm that is quite contagious. Among his shots were some fine photos of Ourisia macrophylla var meadii under cultivation at Otari. I had not seen this before and it is certainly distinct from the type form which is common on Egmont, and from the larger var robusta with which I was so familiar on Ruapehu during the war years.
