## A BIBLICAL GARDEN

A pleasant half hour can be spent at St. Paul's Anglican Church, Symonds St, where a well labelled biblical garden has been planted. The garden is full of surprises. Many of the plant names in the Bible are quite different from the common names used today. Those with well known names, without any surprises, are: barley, bay tree, beans, box tree, bramble or briar, cedar of Lebanon, cucumber, fig, flax, garlic, leeks, mustard, myrtle, onions, palm, plane tree, pomegranate, wheat. Names which are less well known or less obvious are listed as they appear on the labels. Some are not quite right, others are clearly wrong (here marked \*). References used were:
