Simpson and Scott Thomson, in Transactions of the Royal Society of New \&ealand, Vol. 72, part 1, June 1942, publish "Notes on some New. Zealand Plants and Descriptions of New species (No:2)". Supilementary notes are given rugarding 20 species and one species is reduced to a varietty. Four hybrids are discussed, an unexpected combination being recorded in olegria avicenniaefolia x Celmisia du rietzij. New varieties described total 9, and new species 10, the latter distributed as follows: Sophora 1 (Tread well's kowhai of gardens now becomes Solongicarinata), Hoheria 1, Hebe 2, Yeronica 2, Celmisia 2, Senecio 20
